I. CALL TO ORDER

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER CRAIN TO APPROVE THE APRIL 23, 2019 MINUTES, AND SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER BALDINO. MOTION PASSED BY UNANIMOUS CONSENT.

IV. REPORTS

Arlington Heights Memorial Library – Chair Spicer said the 13th Annual Teen Film Fest screenings will occur on August 9, 2019 and films must be submitted by August 1, 2019. He shared that the drop in finals study lounge is occurring May 28 – June 5, 2019. Chair Spicer said this will be his last meeting with the Commission, as he has a new job. He said he was very proud of what the Commission has accomplished and that it was a pleasure to work with everyone on the Commission.

Park District – Commissioner Healy said the Recreation Park swimming pool is now open. All of the outdoor pools will open starting Memorial Day weekend. He said the Picnic in the Park event will occur at North School Park on June 7, 2019 from 4:30pm - 7:30pm. He encouraged the Commissioners to stop by so they can get a feel for the

layout in preparation for the National Night Out event. He said the new Therapy Pool that is under construction at Olympic Park should be completed by June 2020.

Police Department – Commissioner Gombar said Prom is next week for Hersey High School students.

School District – Commissioner Dyer said District 25 is making preparations for the end of the school year. The students get out on June 10, 2019 due to snow days. Their Prom is also next week.

Commissioners at Large – The Commissioners shared that they are currently involved in Advanced Placement (AP) testing, preparation for finals and graduation.

Plans for Summer/National Night Out

Chair Spicer said that the National Night Out event is in August 2019 and asked for suggestions regarding what we could do at the Youth Commission booth. Commissioner Gumbar provided an overview of what occurs at the National Night Out event. She recommended having a “giveaway” that would attract people to the booth, such as glow sticks. Chair Spicer said we still have some money available in our Youth Commission budget that could be used for this purpose. Commissioner Goldberg recommended a large glow sign with neon pens that teens visiting the booth could write on to capture their attention. He said they could respond to a question posed by the Commission, such as “What would you like to see in our community for teens” or “What could we do to help make teens’ lives better.” Commissioner Healy said he could also see if the Park District could provide something that could be used by the Commission, such as a dunk tank. Commissioner Baldino shared examples of interactive games that her church used at events that may be of interest to teens, depending on how much space would be available for the Commission to use. Commissioner Goldberg also recommended a large Jenga game would fun. Commissioner Dwyer said she has several Jenga games which could be used at the event. Commissioner Kho recommended using glow in the dark paint to draw attention to the booth. The Commission decided that they wanted to have a meeting in June to discuss these suggestions further.

The meeting was adjourned to tour the new Police Department facility.
