I. CALL TO ORDER

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

IV. REPORTS

Park District – Commissioner Healy said that Trunk or Treat will be held Friday, October 27, 2017 from 6:00pm-8:15pm at Public Works.

School District – Commissioner Moore said the District 54 Reach & Run was last Sunday.

Arlington Heights Memorial Library – Chair Spicer reported that they have a new interactive exhibit titled “#be in the circle” that runs from October 1st – November 5th. This interactive exhibit allows you to experience how social media influences us, individually and collectively.
