I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Arlington Heights Youth Commission was called to order by Chair Spicer at 6:07pm at the Arlington Heights Memorial Library.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Kho to approve the March 23, 2017 minutes and seconded by Commissioner Moore. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

IV. REPORTS

Park District – Commissioner Healy reported that because of the successful 2017 Teen Job Fair, the Park District hired many referees for this summer. He also said volunteers are needed for Frontier Days if anyone is interested.

School District – District 214 has prom scheduled for June 2nd and graduation June 4th. District 25 8th graders are graduating June 7th and June 8th.

Arlington Heights Memorial Library – Chair Spicer reported that the Teen Final Study Lounge is open for studying for finals. The library we will be developing a Teen Film Fest kit for checkout of the library where teens can get video equipment and tools to make their own movie.

Police Department – Officer Hamrick said that some Arlington Heights Police will be at the Dunkin Donuts on Rand for “Cop on a Rooftop” which is a Special Olympic fundraiser. June 8th is “Rockin’ with the Cops” for 5th graders. June 4th is the “Torch Run” another fundraiser for Special Olympics.

A. **Planning Movie Night** – The Commissioners discussed the pros and cons of hosting their first Teen Movie Night and Commissioner Healy and Commissioner Robinson

talked about the Park District hosting movies once per month. Chair Spicer thought this summer was too soon to host a Movie Night and asked for thoughts from the Commissioners. After discussion, Commissioner Healy recommended the Youth Commission volunteer/attend the July 21st Park District Movie at Recreation Park so they can see firsthand how it is run. Chair Spicer agreed and said he would contact the Commissioners.

The Youth Commission will plan a movie night this fall for next summer. This way, they should have enough time to have information ready for the Library newsletter and the Park District Summer Brochure. They plan to have Food Trucks and maybe the Popcorn Machine from Village Hall.
