IV. REVIEW & APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Moore to approve the April 21, 2014 minutes, seconded by Commissioner Doro. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

VI. REPORTS

Police Department – Commander Hernandez reported that Peer Jury met in May with one individual for theft and a curfew violation. They recommended 30 hours of community service. Commissioner Spicer asked what the curfew hours were and Commissioner Hernandez responded that it is 11:00pm during the week and 12:00am on weekends. There were four more individuals who were in front of Peer Jury for criminal trespass to a residence.

Commissioner Hernandez said the Police Department is getting ready for Frontier Days. The School Resource Officers were present during Frontier Days last year, which seemed to help curtail underage drinking and will be present again this year. The three canine handlers and their dogs will be involved in a presentation during the Festival.

Commander Hernandez stated the Police Department held a memorial service last week honoring the Arlington Heights Police Officers killed in the line of duty, as they do each May. Three students from Hersey High School assisted in the service; one singing the National Anthem and two playing taps.

Park District – Commissioner Robinson said the Dog Park will be open June 21st and they are sold out of dog memberships – 500 total! Frontier and Pioneer pools open on May 24th with the other outdoor pools will open after school gets out. Camelot Park’s updating/construction is on schedule and expected to be finished in late September or October.

School District – Chair Dyer stated that the last day of school is Thursday, June 5th for District 25. District 214’s last day of school is June 6, 2014.

Arlington Heights Memorial Library – Commissioner Spicer said the Library is partnering with the Park District summer volunteer squads made up of middle and high school students who want to volunteer on a specific topic. There is a “sprout squad” which will run a community garden at Olympic.

Final Exam study lounge is available for students at the Library from May 31 – June 6th.

Youth Members – The Commissioners shared their summer adventures.
