**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE ARLINGTON HEIGHTS
COMMISSION FOR CITIZENS WITH DISABILITIES**

June 12, 2018

I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Arlington Heights Commission for Citizens with Disabilities was called to order by Chairman Goldberg at 7:12pm in the Buechner Room at Village Hall.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner McCarty to approve the May 8, 2018 minutes as corrected, seconded by Commissioner Goldberg. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

IV. REPORTS

A. DISABILITY SERVICES UPDATE

Coordinator Robb reported that he had helped a resident who had lost his voice due to a rare condition. He could hear, but could not speak. He had been trying to set up an appointment at Shirley Ryan Ability Center in Chicago with a speech pathologist for three months. Coordinator Robb was able to set up the appointment for him. He also gave him an application for a TTY and advised him that smartphones have a TTY function. He also referred him to the Federal Communication Commission's Internet Protocol (IP) Relay System. <https://www.fcc.gov/tags/ip-relay-0> for Deaf, hard of hearing, and speech impaired callers.

B. DISABILITY LAW UPDATE

Chairman Calibraro reported that on May 16th the Department of Transportation had requested public comments be filed on the issue of bringing animals on airplanes in order to curb the presence of fake service animals, limit the plethora of the kinds of animals that people think they can bring on planes, and to create a sense of order as to the kind of training and certification an animal needs to travel on an airplane. The comments began on May 16th and will continue until July 9th. Anyone can submit comments and you do not have to be a person with a

disability. Information can be found on the Department of Transportation's website www.dot.gov. Guide dogs are still allowed to enter the plane, pet dogs and cats must be in a carrier. Emotional comfort animals will require a doctor's note of necessity and proof that the animal is clean and well behaved.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT VIDEO & EMPLOYMENT PACKET

Coordinator Robb reported that he had reached out to DORS (Department of Rehabilitation Services) and wrote them a summary of the meeting that he had attended. Cynthia Lilburn had written back that she had changed positions and had copied the e-mail to Carrie Frazier who is now in her position. Carrie reached out via e-mail. She noted that they are eager to partner with the Commission, but because of short staff she did not have the time to devote to it at this time. She also said that she would be happy to assist the Commission in soliciting employer nominations for the Disability Employment Awareness Award.

B. CAPTIONING

Coordinator Robb reported that he was asked to put together information for the Assistant Village Manager so that she could determine how the Village would proceed. He contacted all of people that are currently working with the live broadcasts and Village web site and forwarded the information to the Assistant Village Manager.

C. CONNECTIONS NEWSLETTER

Coordinator Robb reported that the Connections newsletter had been completed and he passed out a draft copy for the Commission to look at. He said that it would be published and sent out sometime next week.

D. FRONTIER DAYS

Commissioner McCarty reported that she sent in the application for the 2018 July 4th parade. She also ordered and received the flags for the parade and the film for the carnival and asked for an update on the pictures promised for use on the float. Commissioner Goldberg will be contacting the Maccabi Games, and Special Olympics. Special Olympics is also participating in the parade and will be marching right behind us. Commissioner McMahon reported on what she had found available for purchase. Commissioner McCarty noted that materials are needed as early as possible in order to be included on the float.

Commissioners Klein, Ramsey and Mullinax will take pictures along with Coordinator Robb. Commissioners should meet at the registration area at 9:15am.

Coordinator Robb reported that he had ordered the new Commission shirts and they will be available for the parade and carnival.

E. DISABILITY AWARENESS MONTH

DORS will be assisting with soliciting nominations. The nomination form will be in the Connections Newsletter. Chairman Calibraro urged commissioners to approach businesses they know to encourage them to apply with self-nominations.

F. SPRING PRESENTATION

Chairman Calibraro suggested this be tabled for a couple of months. Commissioner Goldberg reported that he had attended another presentation given by Senator Tammy Duckworth. He would like to pursue possibly getting her to come and present to the Commission.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

Chairman Calibraro reported that she had received notice of the Board meeting about the Village's action plan. Comments will be heard for receiving CDBG block grant funds.

VII. OTHER BUSINESS

- A. Commissioner Mullinax completed and turned in her Statement of Economic Interest.
- B. Commissioner Goldberg reported that we were definitely guaranteed the Northpoint Jewel location for the Knights of Columbus fundraiser. Commissioners were asked to collect and get as many volunteers as possible to fill the schedule for the two days.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT

With no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Commissioner McMahon, seconded by Commissioner Goldberg. Motion passed by unanimous consent. The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm.
