APPROVAL OF MINUTES

COMMISSIONER SEITZ-PAGANO MADE A MOTION, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WOLF, TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM THE APRIL 5, 2023 ARTS COMMISSION MEETING. ALL WERE IN FAVOR. THE MOTION CARRIED.

LIGHT PROJECTION MAPPING

Staff Liaison Derek Mach explained that Mr. George Berlin reached out and provided a proposal for \$1,500 in order to help the Commission plan an art display in the downtown. Staff Liaison Derek Mach commented that prior to considering Mr. Berlin's proposal, a general plan for the light mapping should be shared with staff. Commissioner Seitz-Pagano suggested that the Commission develop a few potential locations, a budget and a timeline. Commissioner Souter commented that the display could be featured after the holidays during the downtime to help attract more patrons to the Downtown. The Commission agreed to put together to a plan to share with staff and will revisit the proposal from Mr. Berlin pending staff feedback.

ARTS OUTREACH EVENT

Staff Liaison Derek Mach commented that the date for the event needs to be finalized. Arts Chair Schurtz commented that the details will be finalized at the June Arts Commission meeting so that the event can begin to be promoted.

COMMISSION FEEDBACK – STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

Staff Liaison Derek Mach commented the Village Manager is requesting feedback from each Commission in order to contribute to the upcoming Strategic Priorities process for 2024-25. Staff Liaison Derek Mach explained that the Village Board would like feedback from the Arts Commission regarding important issues the Village Board should consider discussing in 2024 and 2025 related to the arts. The Village Board is not looking for detailed projects, but rather a general idea of issues that the Commission thinks is current and important for the community. Staff Liaison Derek Mach commented that Commissioner Souter developed a draft and the Commission reviewed. The Commission agreed on the following statement:

To promote local art and creativity, while fostering a greater sense of community through engagement and collaboration. The Arts Commission emphasized the importance of showcasing the talents of local artists through various disciplines and events, while building a bridge between residents and local businesses in order to promote both the arts and the local economy.
