**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE ARLINGTON HEIGHTS
COMMISSION FOR CITIZENS WITH DISABILITIES
May 8, 2018**

I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Arlington Heights Commission for Citizens with Disabilities was called to order by Chairman Calibraro at 7:01pm in the Buechner Room at Village Hall.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Goldberg to approve the corrected March 13, 2018 minutes, seconded by Commissioner McMahon. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

IV. REPORTS

A. DISABILITY SERVICES UPDATE

Coordinator Robb said that he would give his quarterly report in June.

B. DISABILITY LAW UPDATE

Chairman Calibraro reported on a consent decree with the Department of Justice regarding polling places on Arizona Properties. Some are on Indian Reservations who thought they did not need to comply with the ADA, but are required and have agreed to make polling places accessible - physically accessible and accessible for people with vision impairments. A task force has been assembled to monitor the progress for compliance.

H.R. 620 the U.S. Senate Bill proposed to modify Title III of the ADA to make it more difficult to file public accommodation complaints against inaccessible businesses by citizens with disabilities. Tammy Duckworth with 63 other U.S. Senators have blocked the vote in the Senate. Coordinator Robb will forward emails he has received on the topic to Commissioners.

C. NORTH AND NW COOK & LAKE COUNTY WORKGROUP UPDATE

Commissioner Klein did not attend the last meeting and had nothing new to report. He mentioned a time and date conflict due to volunteering at Countryside on the day the North Cook and NW Cook & Lake County Workgroup meets, but will try to make it to the meeting when he can.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT VIDEO & EMPLOYMENT PACKET

Coordinator Robb reported he met with Department of Rehabilitation Services (DORS) staff on March 9, 2018 at their office. He conveyed the Commission's wishes to partner with them to promote disability employment in Arlington Heights and to develop a video for the cable access channel to promote DORS vocational job placement services for people with disabilities and the Commission's Disability Employment Awareness Award. He followed up with a "thank you" email, but has not heard back from them in two months.

Coordinator Robb will forward emails he sent to DORS to Chairman Calibraro to help her draft a follow-up letter seeking a response from them.

B. CAPTIONING

Coordinator Robb reported that he still needs to draft a memo to James McCalister and Diana Mikula regarding what it would entail to caption the online videos and to have live captions available in the Board Room during Board meetings. A discussion ensued about live captioning devices used at AMC Movie Theaters for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing audience. The theater captioning device is placed in the person's drink holder for individualized use.

C. CONNECTIONS NEWSLETTER

Coordinator Robb reported that he has received several articles from Commissioners for the Spring/Summer newsletter. Commissioner McCallum intends to submit an article on disclosing one's disability in an employment interview via "Impression Management." Coordinator Robb mentioned an article he read about special glasses for people with vision impairments that uses a live feed to a remote viewer who then describes the environment to the person wearing the glasses. Several commissioners were aware of the device/service, but mentioned the expense.

D. APRIL PRESENTATION BY BRIAN RUBIN

Chair Calibraro said the presentation was awesome and was pleased with the turnout. Commissioner McMahon was impressed by Brian Rubin's presentation and follow-up email materials he will forward to her and those who signed up to receive them. Coordinator Robb reported that half the registrants came in

through the Village's online registration option and half via mail for a total of 25 registrants.

E. FRONTIER DAYS – PARADE

Chair Calibraro opened discussion. Mr. Robb reported that the Parade Review Stand will be located on the street across the street from the Library this year. This will provide shade to those sitting on the review stand. Commissioner McCarty will purchase instamatic film for 200 pictures.

Commissioner Goldberg reported that Disability Day check in is 9:30am to 11:00am; carnival rides are open from 10:00am to 11:15am. Lunch and entertainment is from 11:30am to 1:00pm. Located at the west stage where it has been in year's past. Pre-registration online is required at www.frontierdays.org/citizens/ no later than Tuesday June 26th. Rides are for guests with disabilities and one designated ride partner. They will also do walk up registrations the day of, but just for the rides.

Commissioner McCarty reported the parade theme this year is: "Dreams come through under the red, white, and blue." Her husband John has volunteered to help build another cube float this year should the Commission decide to build one. She went on to suggest posting pictures of Para-Olympians on the sides of the cube. Commissioner McMahon said that there may be posters or pictures out there already of Para-Olympians. She has had pictures of various athletes from different organizations in her office. Commissioner Goldberg said it is Special Olympics 50th Anniversary this year; perhaps we could get pictures of athletes from there and/or use their logo. Commissioner Goldberg also said he knows other Special Olympian and Para-Olympian athletes who may wish to march in the parade with the Commission.

Commission shirts were discussed. Having new commissioners warrants getting new shirts. There is a preference for 100 percent cotton shirts verses the nylon ones we have now that are too hot. A sign-in sheet for Men's and Women's Sizes was passed around for each commissioner to write in their size. Blue or white or blue and white cotton polo shirts are preferred.

F. SPONSORSHIP OF CITIZENS WITH DISABILITY DAY

Chairman Calibraro opened discussion. Coordinator Robb reported that the \$1000 check to Frontier Days Inc., for the Commission's sponsorship of the Citizens with Disabilities Day Carnival and Luncheon was processed. The Carnival is on Saturday June 30th.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. DISABILITY AWARENESS MONTH

Chairman Calibraro opened discussion on Disability Awareness Month and mentioned that we need to personally contact businesses and promote the award

to them, as she did with Peggy Kinnane's. Commissioner Goldberg said he will approach McDonalds and Portillo's to advertise the award to them.

B. SPRING PRESENTATION

Chairman Calibraro opened discussion on the Spring Presentation asking for ideas. She went on to describe the need for senior care including long-term care and other senior needs. Commissioner McMahon reported that there is not a lot of long-term care companies left in the business any more due to senior longevity. Coordinator Robb reported that the Senior Center offers presentations on these topics already

VII. OTHER BUSINESS

- A. Chairman Calibraro asked about reappointment of Commissioners to the Commission. Coordinator Robb reported that Commissioners McCarty and Mullinax were reappointed to the Commission and Chair Calibraro was reappointed as Chair to the Commission.
- B. Commissioner Goldberg reported that the Abilities Expo will be at the Renaissance Schaumburg Convention Center from June 29th through July 1st. Registration is free online at: www.abilitiesexpo.com and parking is free.
- C. Commissioner Goldberg also reported that Debbie Reed from the Knights of Columbus, called him about this year's Tootsie Roll Drive fundraiser. The fundraiser is scheduled for September 15th and 16th at the churches, September 21st, and September 22nd on the streets and at stores. She invited the Commission to participate in both events. Thursday, September 20th is the kick-off party at 7:00pm at the Knights Hall located at 15 N. Hickory in Arlington Heights. The Commission prefers to collect on Friday at Mariano's, but if that time is not available they will collect on Friday and Saturday at the Northpoint Jewel. Coordinator Robb will put together the sign-up spreadsheet and forward to Commissioner Goldberg to share with Debbie Reed.
- D. On Friday June 1st the Arlington Heights Fire Department will be hosting their benefit for the Muscular Dystrophy Association at Ditka's. The cost is \$30 for five hours of beverages and appetizers. Last year they made over \$59,000. The event is from 7:00pm to midnight. Seth will be in attendance and there will be a silent auction and "Pop a Cork".

VIII. ADJOURNMENT

With no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Commissioner McCarty, seconded by Commissioner McMahon. Motion passed by unanimous consent. The meeting was adjourned at 8:57pm.
