I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Arlington Heights Youth Commission was called to order by Chair Dyer at 6:04pm in the Commissions Room at Village Hall.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Guerra to approve the February 12, 2015 minutes and seconded by Commissioner Prusener. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

IV. REPORTS

Park District – Commissioner Robinson stated that Matt Healy was sworn in by the Village Board and will represent the Park District on the Youth Commission. He also stated Arlington Lakes Golf Course closes June 1, 2015 and will be closed for a year.

School District – A Walk Fundraiser is scheduled for Saturday, April 11, 2015 for D25, ABC Foundation, and PTA. This is the major fundraiser for the year and starts at South Middle School. Friday, April 10th is the crosstown basketball game, South vs. Thomas at Rolling Meadows High School. This year D25 is raising money for a pulmonary disorder. Chair Dyer mentioned another fundraiser run, Got2Run, which is scheduled for Saturday, May 16th.

Arlington Heights Memorial Library – Commissioner Spicer said that currently there is a Battle of the Recorded Bands contest. Teens can go to the Library and record a song in the digital studio for prizes.

Police Department – Commander Hayes reported that there is a new phone app for safety. The company is linked in with 89% of the cell providers and if you are out for a run and feel unsafe, you open the app and hold your thumb on the screen. If contact is broken, there is

an alert to reset your password. If you don't enter your password the company calls to ask that you enter a password, if there is no answer, they call dispatch directly and through GPS on the cell phone they can tell the exact location. The Police Department has partnered with Lifeline Response in Arlington Heights that runs the app program.

Commander Hayes also reported that the Police Department will now have Naloxone/Narcan available in each squad car, which is the reversal drug for opioid overdoses. The medication will be in an application pack that does not require syringes. These kits are provided by the "Live4Loli" organization.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Teen Job Fair – After discussion the Commission decided to have the next Teen Job Fair hours from 10:00am-1:00pm. With this time frame teens in morning sports would be able to attend. The Commissioners will decide in September, when they have their school schedules, the date of the 2016 Teen Job Fair. Commissioner Robinson will speak to the Chamber of Commerce next year to help advertise the Teen Job Fair.

Commissioner Spicer said he asked teens where they heard about the Teen Job Fair and most mentioned their parents read about it in the Library Newsletter. He talked about videoing teens at work, hired through the fair, to share these video on the video announcements.

Mr. McCalister shared that he went to the Schaumburg Teen Job Fair and everyone that attended received a folder with information. They also had classes in adjacent rooms for teens, i.e. "how to make a resume" and "how to speak to potential employers" and similar topics. The businesses at the job fair also had handouts for teens with their business name, hours needed, pay scale, etc.

The Commissioners also discussed additional campaigns they might be able to sponsor where they might be effective as a Commission i.e. "jaws of life", "pedal cars", "texting and driving" even if they are not able to implement them this year.
