**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING  
OF THE ARLINGTON HEIGHTS  
COMMISSION FOR CITIZENS WITH DISABILITIES**

**February 10, 2015**

**I. CALL TO ORDER**

The regular meeting of the Arlington Heights Commission for Citizens with Disabilities was called to order by Commissioner Danzinger, who ran the meeting in Chairman Goldberg's absence, at 7:10 pm in the Buechner Room at Village Hall.

**III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES**

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mullinax to approve the December 9, 2014 minutes, seconded by Commissioner Calibraro. Motion passed by unanimous consent.**

**IV. REPORTS**

**A. Disability Services Update**

1. Coordinator Robb reported that on January 8<sup>th</sup> he met with Jan Scissors and Eve Lashley from the Arlington Heights Memorial Library. They wanted to discuss how the library was currently serving people with disabilities and how they could better serve people with disabilities. The library is considering adding a special page on their website to highlight programs available to people with disabilities. The library hired a consulting firm, would also like community feedback, and is looking for residents to participate in focus groups. They also offered to do a presentation at a Commission meeting on the programs and services available at the library for people with disabilities. Ways to identify people with disabilities in the community were also discussed.
2. He also reported that he attended a meeting of the Community Education Advisory Committee at Hersey High School. He was impressed how Hersey makes a point of making all of their programs inclusive.
3. Coordinator Robb reported that he had assisted a resident with a disability find financial assistance for her children to go to college.
4. He also did additional work for the MRC.

5. Coordinator Robb will also be putting together the winter issue of Connections. He received articles from some Commissioners and asked for any additional articles to be sent to him as soon as possible.

**B. Disability Law Update**

Commissioner Calibraro reported that it is the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the ADA and thought the Commission should plan to do something to bring attention to it. The Commission discussed ideas for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade.

**V. OLD BUSINESS**

**A. Disability Employment Campaign**

Commissioner Danzinger reported that he had not yet heard from Jim Platt of the Arlington Heights Chamber of Commerce regarding scheduling the Disability Employment presentation. He will follow-up with him as he would like to see it tied in with the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the ADA.

**B. Building Code**

1. Commissioner McMahon reported that she had looked at other communities to see what they had in effect. She looked at Austin, Texas and Bolingbrook, Illinois and went over what each city had adopted. She also found an article that explained how Bolingbrook went about getting theirs adopted. She also found that other communities based their changes on what Bolingbrook did.
2. Coordinator Robb noted that the Illinois Capital Development Board website has a listing of the building codes each jurisdiction is under. It does not, however, show if there have been amendments to the code.

**VI. NEW BUSINESS**

**A. Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Treaty.** Commissioner Danzinger did not have any more information, but will bring it to the March meeting. Coordinator Robb reported that the National Council on Disability has information on their web site. They have signed onto it and are encouraging others to do so.

**B. Disabilities Day Sponsorship at Frontier Days.** Because of his involvement with the Festival Committee, Commissioner Danzinger recused himself from voting on the sponsorship of Disabilities Day at the Festival. Commissioner McCarty pointed out that, with his recusal, there was not a quorum and therefore a vote could not be taken. Approval was tabled until the March meeting.

**VII. OTHER BUSINESS**

**A.** Commissioner Calibraro demonstrated a paper money identifier that is available to people with disabilities. You slide the bill and it verbally tells you the denomination. It is available for free to National Library Service patrons.

**B.** She also demonstrated the KNFB Reader, a reading app that she downloaded to her iPhone. It takes a picture of the document and then the app will read it to her. It is available for \$49.99.

**VIII. ADJOURNMENT**

**With no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Commissioner McMahon and seconded by Commissioner McCarty. Motion passed by unanimous consent. The meeting was adjourned at 7:59 pm.**
