Arlington Heights Memorial Library

Chair Healy reported that he is now the manager of the Arlington Ridge Center. About 3,000 people attended the New Year's Eve opening and there are jobs available. The Park District is looking forward to the Teen Job Fair as they have open positions for the after school care program and the athletic department.

Commissioners at Large

Commissioner Kho stated the Let it Snow information was posted on the job board at Prospect High School. He will drop off the Teen Job Fair information next week. Commissioner Kho visited Chipotle, Fresh Thyme and Goodwill to talk about the Teen Job Fair. The Commission discussed pursuing social media outlets at the high schools to share information regarding the programs.

Commissioner Baldino spoke with a representative at Medieval Times and did not receive confirmation if they will attend the Teen Job Fair. She spoke with the owner at Coco Blu and he said they might be interested. She spoke with staff at Sweet T's but they are looking for bakers. The Let it Snow program brochures will be shared with the Community Service Club.

Commissioner Fahnoe reported that the Let it Snow flyers have been put up in the library and other open areas at Rolling Meadows High School. The information will also be shared on Twitter. She stated that she visited the Ace Hardware on Campbell Street and the Jewel on Vail Street to discuss the Teen Job Fair.

Commissioner Moore went to Culver's and shared information about the Teen Job Fair. Culver's reported the Fair is one of their favorites and they are interested in attending. She spoke with the Chicago Swim School, Marianos and Walgreens.

Commissioner Patel will request that the Let it Snow information be placed on the announcements at the high schools too. She went to Meijer and she will check back with them to see if they are attending.

Mr. McCalister stated that the Senior Center attends and has a table at the Teen Job Fair. He said there are 12 teens signed up for the Let it Snow program, and 156 senior residents enrolled in the program. The area north of Palatine Road does not have anyone signed up and if someone could cover Buffalo Grove High School that would be helpful. Chair Healy stated he would contact Buffalo Grove to send the information to students.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Teen Job Fair

Chair Healy will be working with Commissioner Son to review logistics and the set-up of the tables. Chair Healy stated he would invite everyone to the Google Drive to document businesses that have been contacted. He said if everyone arrives by 5:15 p.m. that would be helpful and he will bring a clicker to track number of attendees. Chair Healy will speak with Commissioner Son to review the list of all the jobs available in the resume room so attendees can review prior to visiting all the tables.

Mr. McCalister stated refreshments were also provided and Chair Healy will connect with Dunkin Donuts. Commissioner Moore said she would connect with Starbucks to

see if they will donate coffee. Mr. McCalister stated to give him all receipts and he will process reimbursement.
