January 22, 2014

I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Arlington Heights Youth Commission was called to order by Chair Dyer at 6:05pm in the Commissions Room at Village Hall.

Commissioner Grace Kho introduced herself and the Youth Commission welcomed her.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Johnson to approve the December 11, 2014 minutes and seconded by Commissioner Moore. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Arlington Heights Memorial Library – No Report

Police Department – Commander Hayes reported that at the end of December and beginning of January there was an arrest of a residential burglary crew along Lake Cook Road and Wilke Road. The main player was an adult with two juvenile accomplices. There were 20-50 houses that they entered. The juveniles were charged in State Court as juveniles and that is pending. No one appeared in front of Peer Jury in December. Chair Dyer asked how teens are referred to Peer Jury. Commander Hayes explained that when a juvenile is arrested, the Officer is presented with many options on how to handle the juvenile arrest i.e. take the juvenile to their parents, an Informal Station Adjustment (a warning and the parents pick up their teen), a Formal Station Adjustment which is the same, but the Juvenile Officer will set parameters (restitution, community service, etc.) or petition them to Juvenile Court where charges are filed and they appear before a judge. Within that Station Adjustment phase, for something not too serious, but not trivial either, we get referrals from the Patrol

Officer for a candidate for Peer Jury. Peer Jury is chance for the offender to appear before his/her peers, accept responsibility for his/her actions, and the Peer Jury implements whatever punishment they feel is necessary – fine, restitution, or apology.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Teen Job Fair – Commissioner Johnson stated that Commissioner Spicer created a Google.doc with all the local businesses and asked everyone to use that one. Commissioner Johnson also asked to extend the deadline for businesses from February 1st to February 10th and everyone agreed. Commissioner Johnson said he has approached Dick's, Petco, and Family Video and they stated that they only hired 18 years and older. He offered them the option of having their applications available for 18 year olds and they all seemed interested. Chair Dyer stated that since the next meeting is February 12th she thought a due date for the businesses of February 10th would work and encouraged the Youth Members to continue to talk to the local businesses.

The Youth Commission talked about creating a new video for the Teen Job Fair.
