Park District – No Report

School District – The Commissioners discussed “Mad Dash – Finals”, Buffalo Grove High School Robotics team, and the Arlington Heights School District 25 Board voting on a proposal from the administration that would eliminate: Family and Consumer Science (all foods, cooking and sewing classes) for all grades, World Cultures/Global Perspectives (current events, political structures & world cultures) for all grades, Industrial Technology/Applied Technology for all grade levels, all 8th grade elective classes at Thomas such as Career Connections, Myth Busters, Entrepreneurship, 3D R&D and Broadcast Journalism, and Computers Class for 7th & 8th grade at South.

Eliminated classes will be replaced with: Science, Technology, Engineering & Math (STEM), Communication Media Arts, and Graphic Design.

Arlington Heights Memorial Library – Commissioner Spicer stated that “Final Exam Study” would be available and information was available on the Library web site.

Police Department – Officer Hamrick stated that the “Befriend A Badge Trading Card Program” started and will work like a scavenger hunt. Officers will attend various events throughout Arlington Heights and trading card officers will have special magnets on their squad cars so children can identify them. They are encouraged to collect all 11 and have them signed by the officer.
