Village of Arlington Heights Youth Commission Meeting Minutes

December 11, 2014

I. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Arlington Heights Youth Commission was called to order by Chair Dyer at 6:05pm in the Commissions Room at Village Hall.

III. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Doro to approve the October 9, 2014 and seconded by Commissioner Moore. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

IV. REPORTS

Park District – No Report

School District – The Commission discussed the State testing and the upcoming possible changes.

Arlington Heights Memorial Library – Commissioner Spicer said that the HUB is ready for final study lounge – this will be the first time that Sylvan Learning tutors by appointment. He also mentioned that with the help from the Teen Advisory Board, they will have goodie bags with props to interact with a movie shown on a big screen during the *Movie Marathon* scheduled for December 26th.

Police Department – Commander Hayes reported that 2 teens presented at Peer Jury in November, none in December.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Teen Job Fair – Commissioner Spicer stated the date for the Teen Job Fair is Saturday, February 21, 2015 and he would adjust the letters from last year, ask Patti to print on Village letterhead, and have copies available at the Library in the HUB for the Youth Members to pick up for distribution to the local businesses. Chair Dyer asked the

Commissioners to check their calendars and at the next meeting let her know who will be available to work at the Teen Job Fair. The Commissioners discussed the room layout, maybe starting a little earlier to set-up, using part of the HUB if they secure more businesses, more hot chocolate, and less coffee. Commissioner Johnson reminded everyone to check off the business name on the Google doc after they visit a business. Commissioner Doro will send out the Google doc and Chair Dyer asked that you initial the doc on the business you plan to visit so the Commission knows. Commissioner Doro asked if anyone knew if there was one place at Randhurst to visit, instead of going to each store. Chair Dyer will research.

The Commissioners will discuss shooting a new video for the Teen Job Fair at the January meeting.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Youth Commission Volunteer Program

Commissioner Spicer said that he is looking into starting a program connecting seniors with youth who may be able to help around the house with snow plowing or raking leaves. He said that the Village of Arlington Heights cannot have a program like this because of liability concerns. He is checking with the Library.

VII. OTHER BUSINESS

Commissioner Fahy stated that on January 19, 2014, the Children of Abraham Coalition, the Jewish Council on Urban Affairs, and the Council on American Relations are sponsoring an Interfaith event in downtown Chicago. She said this will be a gathering of many young people and adults from all religions for discussion after reflection. The Interfaith movement started in 1893 in Chicago.
