James McCalister shared that he is the liaison to the Commission and is the Director of Health & Human Services at Village Hall. He has been with the Village for 31 years and his department consists of Environmental Health Officers, Nursing Services, Social Services, Disability Services and the Senior Center.

Chyrel Moore stated that she is a commissioner at large and resident in Arlington Heights.

Kim Dyer said she teaches at South Middle School and is also a community member.

Grace Baldino stated she has been part of the Commission for just over a year and is a junior at Prospect High School, currently preparing for finals the upcoming week.

Kendall Fahnoe is a sophomore at Rolling Meadows High School and has been part of the Commission for a year and a half. Ms. Fahnoe stated she is also studying for finals next week.

Alya Patel introduced herself and she is new to the Commission. She is a junior at Rolling Meadows High School and is part of the speech and acting teams.

Officer Gombar stated she has been with the Police Department for 6 years. Officer Gombar stated this is her first year as a Student Resource Officer at John Hersey High School.

Jonathon Kho said he is a senior at Prospect High School and has been with the Commission for 2 years.

Snow Shoveling Program

Chair Healy described the Snow Shoveling Program as a shared junction between the Village and the Senior Center to pair seniors and persons with disabilities with young adults to shovel snow.

Mr. McCalister stated there are 150-160 seniors signed up for the program, and 8-9 teens enrolled to shovel snow. More youth participants are needed, and youth can charge a fee for providing this service.

Ms. Dyer will create a slide of information to share electronically with all Commissioners and she will display the information at the middle school.

Chair Healy stated youth commissioners can distribute information at their schools to spread the word too. Flyers were provided to all commissioners. Chair Healy stated he will also distribute information on social media and through the Park District.

Teen Job Fair

Ms. Son stated that the Library has scheduled the Teen Job Fair for February 4, 2020 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. located on the 2nd floor in the Hendrickson Room. Please arrive by 5:30 p.m.

Chair Healy stated the list of businesses is prepared and will send a letter to all businesses on the list. Information will be shared at the Library, on social media and the schools. Chair Healy will update all documents to include the current information.

Ms. Son stated the warm up is a Library program designed to get your jitters out before going upstairs and meeting with the businesses. Chair Healy stated the warm up was very helpful last year and teens were more relaxed during the interviews. The Commission agreed that the font does not need to be changed on the flyer. The AH Youth Commission Facebook page is no longer active and the information will be removed from the flyer. The Library phone number will also be posted on the flyer to answer questions regarding the event and as the contact for businesses.

Mr. McCalister said typically the Library has packets prepared for businesses to pick up with all the information needed.

Ms. Son stated the Library had the Adult Job Fair last month, and she has new businesses to add to the Teen Job Fair, such as the Lutheran Home, Goodwill and Medieval Times.
